ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Material Fee is per week; for other fees, please kindly refer to the TUITION FEE section. The minimum age to join this programme is 12 years. The maximum age to join this programme is 17 years. Applicants must provide all academic records of their previous two years of schooling. Official academic results must be provided at the time of applying. For the purpose of accurate placement, applicants must, at the time of applying, provide either The results certificate from an approved English language proficiency test* undertaken within the previous 12 months; OR Undertake the free Charlton Brown HSP Programme Placement Test. All documents in a language other than English must be accompanied by a NAATI certified translation. *Approved English language proficiency tests include the following: IELTS (Academic) Pearson Test of English (PTE), Cambridge Language Assessment, AEAS, TOEFL or TOEFL iBT.


